## **Recipe Corner**

#### **Chocolate Hazelnut Slice**

#### Denice Fuhrmann

#### Ingredients

#### Base

1 packet Arnotts Marie Biscuits, crushed

1 packet slivered almonds lightly toasted

120g butter

2 tabs golden syrup

Can condensed milk (420g)

#### Topping

60g copha

2 blocks Cadbury hazelnut chocolate

#### Method

#### Base

Combine crushed biscuits and almonds in a large bowl.

In a saucepan, combine butter, golden syrup and condensed milk over low heat.

Simmer gently for about 5 mins.

Add the butter mixture into the biscuits and almonds and mix well.

Press into lined lamington tin.

Place in fridge while preparing the topping.

#### Topping

Melt together copha and chocolate then pour over the base. Refrigerate to set.

Once set, remove from the tin and cut into pieces.



#### **GOLDEN SYRUP SPONGE MUG CAKE**

3 tablespoons of self raising flour

1 1/2 tablespoons of caster sugar

1 egg yolk

2 tablespoons of milk

1 tablespoon of veg or canola oil

1 tablespoon of golden syrup

Extra golden syrup for serving

Scoop of vanilla ice-cream



In a large mug, add flour and sugar, mix to combine. Add egg yolk, milk and oil. Gently mix to combine. Dollop the golden syrup in the middle of the batter, so it sinks through. Place in microwave and zap on high for 1 minute to a minute 10 seconds or until it springs back when touched. (depends on your microwave)

Serve with a scoop of vanilla ice-cream and extra golden syrup.


